November is the month when we traditionally pray for the dead. This is an important part of our catholic heritage and indeed a duty laid upon us to pray for the repose of the dead. We begin the month with the celebration of All Saints, when we ask for the prayers of those already in Heaven. Those unknown to the official calendar of the Church who may not have their own individual date in that calendar but who are known to God. Men and women just like us who have struggled in faithful service and acts of often unnoticed love and kindness not recognized by the world at large perhaps but on this day we recall and celebrate their memory, their influence and example and now ask for their prayers.

2nd November All Souls

Begins our month long commemoration and intercession for those who have died and await entry into heaven. I always find it powerful that those we pray to on 1st November might be, in a strange way, the ones we are praying for on 2nd November. The men and women who have touched, encouraged and heartened us in our lives but who have now died. Are they part of that great panoply of unrecognised saints or are they still awaiting their reward? We cannot know, we entrust the dead to the Lord's mercy and throughout this month we pray for all those who have died. Known and unknown.

To assist us in this act, there is a **Book of the Dead** in the Church at Teignmouth. Please feel free to write in it the names of those whom you wish to be remembered at Masses during the Month. This book will remain in front of the Altar throughout the month but please feel free to come and write those names in it whenever you are able. Parishioners in Shaldon and Dawlish if you would like to enter names but will not be able to get to Teignmouth yourselves then do not hesitate to give Fr Mark the names or ring the office and they can be entered.
