## Primary School Admissions for September 2017

OLSP is part of the Plymouth Catholic and Anglican Schools Trust (CAST), this trust is the Admitting authority for our school. Our School Governors require a completed Supplementary information form by **15<sup>th</sup> January 2017** supported by copies of Birth and Baptismal evidence to enable them to rank applications in accordance with the School Admission Policy, (available on our website and hard copy form the school office).

If you wish to apply for a Primary School place at OLSP you **must also** make a formal application through Devon County Council using the Primary Common Application Form. Details available at

[www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline](http://www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline) or within the First Step primary admissions booklet. Devon CC act as the central co-ordinating agency, allowing Parents to prioritise more than one school and to receive one single offer of a school place on the National Offer Date in April 2017.

**The national application dates for the Reception September 2017 intake is 15<sup>th</sup> November 2016 to midnight on the 15<sup>th</sup> January 2017.**

### The Gospel Reading This Week

This weekend we hear Jesus tell us a story about a Pharisee and a Tax Collector and we learn how to pray and have a good heart.

The Pharisee goes to the Temple to pray, but he is full of pride. He thinks he's brilliant, that he's done everything right and that God must love him very much. Then a tax collector comes to pray. The tax collector is humble and ashamed. He knows he has done wrong and he seeks God's forgiveness.


Jesus perhaps wanted the Pharisees (religious leaders) and us, to understand that the things we actually say when we pray are not as important as what is in our hearts, what we're thinking and feeling deep down.

The Pharisees thought that the way to enter God's kingdom was by keeping a lot of rules and making new rules. The Pharisees thought that all the people who didn't keep their rules were bad and unacceptable to God.

There is nothing wrong with rules. Every family, school, church and organisation has them. Rules are necessary aren't they? We can all think about why we need some rules in life. I'm sure that you have rules at home and here at school. Rules are here to guide us and they should help us think about what other people need. We should always be concerned about other people. Yet there is something wrong with thinking that we are better than other people just because we keep certain rules. We all do things wrong sometimes. We need to own up and ask forgiveness and accept that although others are different to us they are still loved by God.

The two men behaved very differently in the temple that day. The Pharisee was proud and thought he was better than other people, the tax collector knew that he wasn't better than other people and that only God could give him the forgiveness and mercy he needed. The Pharisee judged the tax collector. He thought that the tax collector wasn't as good as he was. But we are all equal in the eyes of God, who loves us all.

**I wonder how we too can learn to pray with a good heart.**
