We are thinking about a theme for our Family and Friends Breakfast next half term. Do you have an idea we might use?

The Gospel Reading This Week

This weekend we hear about how ten people with skin disease (lepers) were healed by Jesus but only one of them said 'thank you'. We are thinking especially about the importance of saying thank you to each other and to God this week.

We are often reminded how important it is to have good manners. When we ask for something, we should say *Please*. And when we receive something, we should say *Thank you*. **I wonder how often we get told to say please and thank you and who by?**

By being thankful we show we're happy with what we've got and we recognise how generous the other person has been by giving it to us.

While all ten men were happy to receive the gift, only one of them gave thanks to Jesus and praised God. Many people with this illness lose all of their fingers and toes because of the disease. It is very painful. People with leprosy couldn't get too close to others for fear of spreading the illness. They couldn't even hug their families or friends anymore.

Can you imagine how hard that must be? Imagine if you weren't able to hug or be close to the people you love, how would you feel?

On the way to see the priest the men noticed their skin had changed, the leprosy was gone. They were healed! **I wonder how those men felt when they realised that they were well again?**

I also wonder what the nine men who didn't return to Jesus did instead.

Perhaps they ran home to their families and friends. After all, they'd been living away from them for ages. Can you imagine how excited they were and how happy their families must have been to see them and hug them again?

Only one man went back to show how grateful he was for what had been done for him - for the gift of health and a new life with his family.

Try to think hard with your family this week about what has God given to you (e.g. a family, friends, all the animals and plants in the world, love, talents etc.)

Like the man who returned to Jesus, we should try to praise and thank God at all times for the amazing things that we have been given.
